

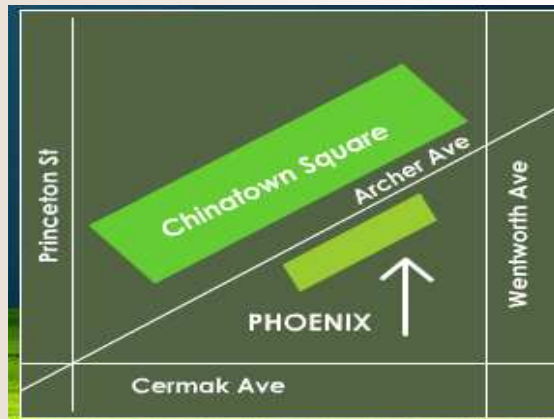

In the CALA 2010 Strategic Plan (approved by the CALA Board on June 10, 2007), the first major step towards reaching the goal of "Becoming a Leader in Global Reach Initiatives" is to develop formal structure within CALA to better coordinate the CALA 21st Century Librarian Seminar and other training programs in China. Through three years of hard work and dedicated research, the CALA 21st Century Librarians Seminar Series has been conducted in more than ten academic and public libraries in different cities across China. Forty CALA members, including current and former ALA Presidents Jim Rettig, Lorine Roy and Barbara Ford have joined the Series and trained and/or exchanged their experiences and knowledge with Chinese librarians. Our seven panelists, listed below, will present different viewpoints on how to successfully create outreach programs for these Chinese libraries. In doing so, we will examine the Series' origins, its development over time, and impacts it has had on the library profession as a whole. We will also share our experiences with other librarians nationwide, and create a plan to further our goals in the future.

Barbara J. Ford is director of the Mortenson Center for International Library Programs and Mortenson Distinguished Professor at the Library of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. She was the 1997-1998 president of the American Library Association (ALA) and her theme was “Libraries: Global Reach, Local Touch.”

Barbara previously worked at the Chicago Public Library, and in libraries at Virginia Commonwealth University, Trinity University in San Antonio and the University of Illinois at Chicago as well as at the Illinois Natural History Survey. She was a Peace Corps volunteer in Panama and Nicaragua.

She was president of the Association of College and Research Libraries from 1990 until 1991. She currently is a member of the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) Governing Board. In 2008 Barbara received the ALA John Ames Humphrey OCLC Forest Press Award in recognition of significant contributions to international librarianship.



Guoqing Li graduated from Beijing University (1982) and Indiana University (1992), worked at Indiana University Library (1992-94) and University of Florida Library (1994-96) before came to the Ohio State University Library, currently a professor and Chinese/Korean Studies Librarian at OSU. Have been a life member of CALA since 1992, worked with colleagues in many committees, such as CALA Goal 2000 Task Force (97-98) Public Relations Committee (98-99), Membership Committee (99-00), Program Committee (03-04), International Relations Committee (04-05, 06-08), CALA 21st Century Librarian Seminar Project Task-force (07- present) and CALA Special Liaison for China Relations (08-

present). Published more than 20 books and more than 40 articles in many fields.



Donglai Li is Director of Dongguan Library, Guangdong Province of China. After graduation from Peking University in 1984, he worked in Liaoning Provincial Library and promoted to be assistant librarian in 1996. In 2002, Mr. Li began his career at Dongguan Library. He has got his academic title of research librarian and is also a professor of Peking University. Besides, Mr. Li is a committee member both of National Technical Committee for Standardization of Information and Documentation and National Technical Committee for Standardization of Library, Director of Library and Social Reading committee of Library Association of China, and Judge of Innovation Award of Ministry of Culture of China.

Shu-Hua Liu is a reference librarian at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Library, a joint library of San Jose State University and San Jose Public Library. She received her MLIS degree from San Jose State University and BA degree from National Taiwan Normal University. She is the recipient of several distinguished honors including ALA Spectrum Scholar, Emerging Leader, CLA Edna Yelland Scholarship, Education Grant from California State Library and reference scholarship from SJSU.



She has extensive experience in instruction, curriculum design and application of technology. She actively participates in professional associations and committee work in ALA. Especially she has a career passion for the diverse and underserved community and firmly believes libraries and librarians can change lives.

Dr. Mengxiong Liu is Professor and Engineering Librarian at San Jose State University, San Jose, California. She received her Ph.D. in Library and Information Studies from the University of Michigan. In more than 20 years, Dr. Liu has made significant contributions to library and information science by researching, teaching, and publishing in the United States and worldwide. Dr. Liu is actively involved in the American Library Association and the ethnic librarians associations. She was a member on ALA Steering Committee of Spectrum Scholarship Initiative, and a member on the ALA Diversity Council. She was the past President and Board Member of the Chinese American Librarians Association. In 2007, Dr. Liu won the Fulbright Senior Specialist Award and completed her Fulbright trip to Uruguay.
